- Hit Rate - has reduced compared to 2018.
 - 2010 winner's HR was 68.2%
 - 2011 winner's HR was 78.04%
 - 2012 winner's HR was 78.28%
 - 2013 winner's HR was 75.76% (Harder with Suns improving and Gazza dominating.)
 - 2014 winner's HR was 74.2 and 74.7%
 - 2015 winner's HRs were 73.2, 72.2 and 71.7%
 - 2016 winner's HR was 74.7%
 - 2017 winner's HR was 70.20%

- 2018 winner's HR was 73.23%
 - 2019 winner's HR was 70.20%
- Round 1 was the toughest tipping week with 6 upsets. Geelong beating Collingwood was one of the upsets back then. Michael Verrier and Daniel Tucker did best on the hardest week of the year with an impressive 7/9.
 - Tipper Tote Tas Favourites ended on equal 34th with 137 points, a full 10 tips worse than the 2018 result of 147 points, and 10 points behind our winner too.
 - Joe Average (who tips the most popular tips from HAT tippers) was just 1 point behind on 136 points.
 - Our winner, Mark Drew submitted tips for all 23 rounds. He bombed out in round 1 of Hot Tips picking Adelaide who lost to Hawthorn. He managed to stay alive for 3 weeks in Hot Tips #2, until Western Bulldogs let him down losing to St Kilda.
 - Ladder Predictions: Start of the year - you put the AFL ladder in to what you thought it would be come Round 23...
 - On average Melbourne were selected at 4. They actually finished 17th. How wrong we were
 - Brisbane were collectively selected at 14th, but managed 12 places better at 2nd.
 - Five teams finished exactly in the ladder position predicted by the average ladder. GWS in 6th, Essendon in 8th, Hawthorn in 9th and Carlton in 16th and Gold Coast in 18th.
 - Melbourne and Adelaide were the two teams we expected to make the eight - but did not. Adelaide did the same in 2018.
 - Tippers: 29 Aurora; 103 TasNetworks; 20 Hydro; 149 Family and Friends

- There were no rounds this year when all the favourites won. There were four rounds with just 1 upset: rounds 6,9, 13, and 23. The toughest rounds had 6 upsets: rounds 1, 2, and 4. There were 206 tippers with hit rates less than 50% after round 4. Mark Drew (our winner) had a solid hit rate of 67% at that stage.
- 164 tippers (just over 50%) put in tips for all 23 rounds.
- 29 tippers (9.6%) put in tips for their team all 22 games.

We gave away a total of just over three grand (\$3,280) in Weekly Prizes (Round Winners, Hot Tips, Quarterly Tipping, Power Tipping and Shaw Thing Tipping)

- The most certain result of the year was West Coast beating Gold Coast at Optus Stadium, Perth in Round 7.
 - 289 people backed the Eagles, who won 11.14 80 to 8.9 57
 - Edward Robertson was the only tipper to submit a tip for the Suns in the game. Computer Tippers Johnny Random and Albert Awaygames were also on the Suns.
- There were 70 upsets all year. That is games where team most people tipped didn't win. 9 more than last year's 61.
- The biggest upset of the year was in round 5 when Fremantle 16.10 106 beat GWS Giants 11.16 82 @ the UNSW Canberra Oval.
- Only 3 tippers got it right! Christine Dennison, Sally Bennett, and Natalie Weaver...
- Most *Deluded* supporters were Melbourne and Least *Deluded* North Melbourne

- This year five tippers got 0 for a round when actually tipping. They were:

- Albert AwayGames, the computer tipper who tips the visitors each week came dead last, with a hit rate of 43%.
- Lowest score for someone who entered tips every round was Sydney fan Liv Hoare, with a score of 106. A hit rate of 51%. Good job Liv for not giving up.
- This year the title of least Loyal Supporters goes to Jarad Hughes who each tipped Carlton just once all year, for no wins:
- Geelong had the most loyal supporters having 13 followers who tipped them every round.
